## Winter Campout



### Wingbermuehle's Happy Place December 3 – 5, 2011 Kali Dinner

Meet at Stanton on December 2 at 5:45 pm, depart at 6:00.  
Scouts should arrange to be picked up at Stanton at 12:30 on Sunday.

Scouts **MUST** be prepared for the weather. Temperatures at night could be below freezing and the days might be cold. All Scouts must have clean, dry clothes (underwear) for each night and layers for the day time. Gloves and hats, plus boots, are a requirement for attending the campout. Scouts must be able to show these items to a leader on Friday at Stanton before departing. Socks that do not completely cover the ankle should not be worn. All Scouts must have a sleeping pad, preferably closed cell, and a good sleeping bag. Fleece liners are useful if the nights are cold.

Patrols should plan for a cooked breakfast on Saturday, a cooked or non-cooked lunch on Saturday, and a non-cooked breakfast on Sunday. The emphasis should be on food that fuels your body. Menus must be approved at the Troop Meeting on November 30.

Saturday dinner will be a Kali Cookout. Each Patrol will prepare one part of the meal. The total number of Scouts and Leaders attending will be provided to each Patrol on November 30. The menu items are:

Meat – Leaders

Pasta – Leaders

Salad – Ravens

Corn and Green Beans – Dragons

Potatoes -- Panthers

Warm Rolls – Scorpions

Desert – Pine Trees

Patrols must make sure they bring cooking equipment large enough to cook their course for the entire group. We will have all of the Troop's dutch ovens available plus a couple of extras. Patrols will be given the deadline for preparation so all items are ready at the same time.

Activities during the campout will include a hike, a campfire, and free time for advancement or just enjoying the outdoors. Saturday morning will be devoted to completion of Tenderfoot, 2<sup>nd</sup> Class and 1<sup>st</sup> Class outdoor requirements for all 1<sup>st</sup> Year Scouts.

Freeze-Out patches will be given to everyone who attends if water in a bucket freezes solid at the top overnight.  
The Scoutmaster determines what solid means.

**All Patrols are responsible for bringing their own charcoal for cooking. Patrols must remember that cold requires more charcoal.**
